- 1.1 The procurement of accommodation, goods or services will be at the SAFCOL’s sole and absolute discretion and the SAFCOL reserves the right, including without limitation: not to accept any proposal/bid and to cancel the RFP and this TOR, without awarding any contract; unilaterally to amend/supplement/split the specifications on the basis of which the RFP and this TOR is made, including but without limiting, the right to withdraw any part of the service requirement;
 - 1.1.1 to ask clarification of their proposals/bids from any one or more of the bidders;
 - 1.1.2 to conduct one or more inspections *in loco* at the venues and facilities offered; and
 - 1.1.3 to link any conditions, it deems appropriate to its acceptance of any bid.
- 1.2 the RFP, its advertisement or this TOR does not constitute an offer. The aforementioned documents intend only to provide enough information for the preparation and submission of comparable proposals by the bidders.
- 1.3 the lowest or any proposal/bid may not necessarily be accepted.
- 1.4 nothing in the RFP, this TOR or in the advertisements published in respect of the RFP or in the actions of the SAFCOL, the Head/Acting Head of the SAFCOL, the SAFCOL’s agents, members, officials or employees must be construed as creating any expectation, legitimate or otherwise, regarding matters dealt with in the RFP, the advert for the RFP or this TOR or any other matters.

 - 2.1.2 Bidders should check the numbers of the pages to satisfy themselves that none is missing or duplicated. SAFCOL will accept NO liability in regard to anything arising from the fact that pages are missing or duplicated.
- 2.2 I/We hereby Bid to supply all or any of the supplies and/or to procure all or any of the services described in the attached documents to SAFCOL on the terms and conditions and in accordance with the specifications stipulated in the Bid documents (and which shall be taken as part of, and incorporated into, this Bid) at the prices inserted therein.

Confidentiality

- 2.9 The information contained in this document is of a confidential nature and must only be used for purposes of responding to this RFP. This confidentiality clause extends to bidder, partners and/or implementation agents, whom the Bidder may decide to involve in preparing a response to this RFP.
- 2.10 For purposes of this process, the term “Confidential Information” shall include all technical and business information, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, all secret knowledge and information (including any and all financial, commercial, market, technical, functional and scientific information, and information relating to a party’s strategic objectives and planning and its past, present and future research and development), technical, functional and scientific requirements and specifications, data concerning business relationships, demonstrations, processes, machinery, know how, architectural information, information contained in a party’s software and associated material and documentation, plans, designs and drawings and all material of whatever description, whether subject to or protected by copyright,

patent or trademark, registered or un-registered, or otherwise disclosed or communicated before or after the date of this process.

- 2.11 The receiving party shall not, during the period of validity of this process, or at any time, thereafter, use or disclose, directly or indirectly, the confidential information of SAFCOL (even if received before the date of this process) to any person whether in the employment of the receiving party or not, who does not take part in the performance of this process.
- 2.12 The receiving party shall take all such steps as may be reasonably necessary to prevent SAFCOL's confidential information coming into the possession of unauthorized third parties. In protecting the receiving party's confidential information, SAFCOL shall use the same degree of care, which does not amount to less than a reasonable degree of care, to prevent the unauthorized use or disclosure of the confidential information as the receiving party uses to protect its own confidential information.
- 2.13 Any documentation, software or records relating to confidential information of SAFCOL, which comes into the possession of the receiving party during the period of validity of this process or at any time thereafter or which has so come into its possession before the period of validity of this process shall:
 - 2.13.1 be deemed to form part of the confidential information of SAFCOL;
 - 2.13.2 be deemed to be the property of SAFCOL;
 - 2.13.3 not be copied, reproduced, published or circulated by the receiving party unless and to the extent that such copying is necessary for the performance of this process and all other processes as contemplated in; and
 - 2.13.4 be surrendered to SAFCOL on demand, and in any event on the termination of the investigations and negotiations, and the receiving party shall not retain any extracts.

3 News and press releases

- 3.1 Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFP or the awarding of the same or any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, SAFCOL and its Client.

4 Precedence of documents

- 4.1 This RFP consists of a number of sections. Where there is a contradiction in terms between the clauses, phrases, words, stipulations or terms and herein referred to generally as stipulations in this RFP and the stipulations in any other document attached hereto, or the RFP submitted hereto, the relevant stipulations in this RFP shall take precedence.
- 4.2 Where this RFP is silent on any matter, the relevant stipulations addressing such matter, and which appear in the PPPFA shall take precedence. Bidders shall refrain from incorporating any additional stipulations in its proposal submitted in terms hereof other than in the form of a clearly marked recommendation that SAFCOL may in its sole discretion elect to import or to ignore. Any such inclusion shall not be used for any purpose of interpretation unless it has been so imported or acknowledged by SAFCOL.
- 4.3 It is acknowledged that all stipulations in the PPPFA are not equally applicable to all matters addressed in this RFP. It, however, remains the exclusive domain and election of SAFCOL as to which of these stipulations are applicable and to what extent. Bidders are hereby acknowledging that the decision of SAFCOL in this regard is final and binding. The onus to enquire and obtain clarity in this regard rests with the Bidder(s). The Bidder(s) shall take care

to restrict its enquiries in this regard to the most reasonable interpretations required to ensure the necessary consensus.

5 Preferential procurement reform

- 5.1 SAFCOL supports B-BBEE as an essential ingredient of its business. In accordance with government policy, SAFCOL insists that the private sector demonstrates its commitment and track record to B-BBEE in the areas of ownership (shareholding), skills transfer, employment equity and procurement practices (SMME Development) etc.
- 5.2 SAFCOL shall apply the principles of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, (Act No. 5 of 2000) to this proposal read together with the Preferential Regulations, 2022.

6 National Industrial Participation Programme

- 6.1 The National Industrial Participation policy, which was endorsed by Cabinet on 30 April 1997, is applicable to contracts that have an imported content. The NIP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. Bidders are required to sign and submit the Standard Bidding Document (SBD5 is not applicable for this bid.).

7 Language

- 7.1 Bids shall be submitted in English.

8 Gender

- 8.1 Any word implying any gender shall be interpreted to imply all other genders.

9 Headings

- 9.1 Headings are incorporated into this proposal and submitted in response thereto, for ease of reference only and shall not form part thereof for any purpose of interpretation or for any other purpose.

10 Security clearances

- 10.1 Employees and subcontractors of the successful bidder may be required to be in possession of valid security clearances to the level determined by the SSA and/or SAFCOL commensurate with the nature of the project activities they are involved in. The cost of obtaining suitable clearances is for the account of the bidders. The bidders shall supply and maintain a list of personnel involved on the project indicating their clearance status.
- 10.2 Employees and subcontractors of the successful bidder will be required to sign a non-disclosure agreement.

11 Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993

The Bidder warrants that all its employees (including the employees of any sub-contractor that may be appointed) are covered in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993 and that the cover shall remain in force for the duration of the adjudication of this bid and/ or subsequent agreement. SAFCOL reserves the right to request the Bidder to submit documentary proof of the Bidder's registration and "good standing" with the Compensation Fund, or similar proof acceptable to SAFCOL.

12 Formal contract

- 12.1 This RFP, all the appended documentation and the proposal in response thereto read together,

form the basis for a formal contract to be negotiated and finalized between SAFCOL and/or its clients and the enterprise(s) to whom SAFCOL awards the bid in whole or in part.

12.2 Any offer and/or acceptance entered verbally between SAFCOL and any vendor, such offer shall not constitute a contract and thus not binding on the parties.

13 Protection of Personal Information

In responding to this bid, SAFCOL acknowledges that it may obtain and have access to personal data of the respondents. SAFCOL agrees that it shall only process the information disclosed by bidders in their response to this bid for the purpose of evaluating and subsequent award of business and in accordance with any applicable law.

Furthermore, SAFCOL will not otherwise modify, amend or alter any personal data submitted by Respondents or disclose or permit the disclosure of any personal data to any Third Party without the prior written consent from the Respondents. Similarly, SAFCOL requires Respondents to process any personal information disclosed by SAFCOL in the bidding process in the same manner.

14 Reasons for disqualification

14.1 SAFCOL reserves the right to disqualify any bidder, which does any one or more of the following, and such disqualification may take place without prior notice to the offending bidder, however the bidder shall be notified in writing of such disqualification:

- 14.1.1 bidders whose tax matters have not been declared by the South African Tax Revenue services to be in order, or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with the South African Tax Revenue Services to meet the bidder's tax obligations;
- 14.1.2 bidders who submitted incomplete information and documentation essential for the adjudication of the requirements of this RFP;
- 14.1.3 bidders who submitted information that is fraudulent, factually untrue or inaccurate, for example memberships that do not exist, Work references, experience, etc.;

- 1.13 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation of facts in order to influence a procurement process or the execution of a contract to the detriment of any bidder and includes collusive practice among bidders (prior to or after bid submission) designed to establish bid prices at artificial non-competitive levels and to deprive the bidder of the benefits of free and open competition.
- 1.14 "GCC" means the General Conditions of Contract.
- 1.15 "Goods" means all of the equipment, machinery, and/or other materials that the supplier is required to supply to the purchaser under the contract.
- 1.16 "Imported content" means that portion of the bidding price represented by the cost of components, parts or materials which have been or are still to be imported (whether by the supplier or his subcontractors) and which costs are inclusive of the costs abroad, plus freight and other direct importation costs such as landing costs, dock dues, import duty, sales duty or other similar tax or duty at the South African place of entry as well as transportation and handling charges to the factory in the Republic where the supplies covered by the bid will be manufactured.
- 1.17 "Local content" means that portion of the bidding price which is not included in the imported content provided that local manufacture does take place.
- 1.18 "Manufacture" means the production of products in a factory using labour, materials, components and machinery and includes other related value-adding activities.
- 1.19 "Order" means an official written order issued for the supply of goods or works or the rendering of a service.
- 1.20 "Project site," where applicable, means the place indicated in bidding documents.
- 1.21 "Purchaser" means the organisation purchasing the goods.
- 1.22 "Republic" means the RSA.
- 1.23 "SCC" means the Special Conditions of Contract.
- 1.24 "Services" means those functional services ancillary to the supply of the goods, such as transportation and any other incidental services, such as installation, commissioning, provision of technical assistance, training, catering, gardening, security, maintenance and other such obligations of the supplier covered under the contract.
- 1.25 "Written" or "in writing" means handwritten in ink or any form of electronic or mechanical writing.

2 Application

- 2.1 These general conditions are applicable to all Bids, contracts and orders including Bids for functional and professional services, sales, hiring, letting and the granting or acquiring of rights, but excluding immovable property, unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents.

- 2.2 Where applicable, SCC are also laid down to cover specific supplies, services or works.
- 2.3 Where such SCC are in conflict with these general conditions, the special conditions shall apply.

3 General

- 3.1 Unless otherwise indicated in the bidding documents, the purchaser shall not be liable for any expense incurred in the preparation and submission of a bid. Where applicable a non-refundable fee for documents may be charged.
- 3.2 With certain exceptions, invitations to bid are only published in the Government Tender Bulletin. The Government Tender Bulletin may be obtained directly from the Government Printer, Private Bag X85, Pretoria 0001, or accessed electronically from www.treasury.gov.za

4 Standards

- 4.1 The goods supplied shall conform to the standards mentioned in the bidding documents and specifications.

5 Use of contract documents and information; inspection

- 5.1 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, disclose the contract, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample, or information furnished by or on behalf of the purchaser in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by the supplier in the performance of the contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far as may be necessary for purposes of such performance.
- 5.2 The supplier shall not, without the purchaser's prior written consent, make use of any document or information mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 except for purposes of performing the contract.
- 5.3 Any document, other than the contract itself mentioned in GCC clause 5.1 shall remain the property of the purchaser and shall be returned (all copies) to the purchaser on completion of the supplier's performance under the contract if so required by the purchaser.
- 5.4 The supplier shall permit the purchaser to inspect the supplier's records relating to the performance of the supplier and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the purchaser, if so required by the purchaser.

6 Patent rights

- 6.1 The supplier shall indemnify the purchaser against all third-party claims of infringement of patent, trademark, or industrial design rights arising from use of the goods or any part thereof by the purchaser.

7 Performance security

- 7.1 Within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification of contract award, the successful bidder shall furnish to the purchaser the performance security of the amount specified in SCC.
- 7.2 The proceeds of the performance security shall be payable to the purchaser as compensation for any loss resulting from the supplier's failure to complete his obligations under the contract.
- 7.3 The performance security shall be denominated in the currency of the contract, or in a freely convertible currency acceptable to the purchaser and shall be in one of the following forms:
 - 7.3.1 a bank guarantee or an irrevocable letter of credit issued by a reputable bank located in the purchaser's country or abroad, acceptable to the purchaser, in the form provided in the bidding

documents or another form acceptable to the purchaser; or

7.3.2 a cashier's or certified cheque

7.4 The performance security will be discharged by the purchaser and returned to the supplier not later than thirty (30) days following the date of completion of the supplier's performance obligations under the contract, including any warranty obligations, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

8 Inspections, tests and analyses

8.1 All pre-bidding testing will be for the account of the bidder.

8.2 If it is a bid condition that supplies to be produced or services to be rendered should at any stage during production or execution or on completion be subject to inspection, the premises of the bidder or contractor shall be open, at all reasonable hours, for inspection by a representative of the SAFCOL or an organisation acting on behalf of the SAFCOL.

8.3 If there are no inspection requirements indicated in the bidding documents and no mention is made in the contract, but during the contract period, it is decided that inspections shall be carried out, the purchaser shall itself make the necessary arrangements, including payment arrangements with the testing authority concerned.

8.4 If the inspections, tests and analyses referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 show the supplies to be in accordance with the contract requirements, the cost of the inspections, tests and analyses shall be defrayed by the purchaser.

8.5 Where the supplies or services referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 do not comply with the contract requirements, irrespective of whether such supplies or services are accepted or not, the cost in connection with these inspections, tests or analyses shall be defrayed by the supplier.

8.6 Supplies and services which are referred to in clauses 8.2 and 8.3 and which do not comply with the contract requirements may be rejected.

8.7 Any contract supplies may on or after delivery be inspected, tested or analysed and may be rejected if found not to comply with the requirements of the contract. Such rejected supplies shall be held at the cost and risk of the supplier who shall, when called upon, remove them immediately at his own cost and forthwith substitute them with supplies which do comply with the requirements of the contract. Failing such removal, the rejected supplies shall be returned at the suppliers cost and risk. Should the supplier fail to provide the substitute supplies forthwith, the purchaser may, without giving the supplier further opportunity to substitute the rejected supplies, purchase such supplies as may be necessary at the expense of the supplier.

8.8 The provisions of clauses 8.4 to 8.7 shall not prejudice the right of the purchaser to cancel the contract on account of a breach of the conditions thereof, or to act in terms of Clause 23 of GCC.

9 Packing

9.1 The supplier shall provide such packing of the goods as is required to prevent their damage or deterioration during transit to their final destination, as indicated in the contract. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperatures, salt and precipitation during transit, and open storage. Packing, case size and weights shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the goods' final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all points in transit.

9.2 The packing, marking, and documentation within and outside the packages shall comply strictly

with such special requirements as shall be expressly provided for in the contract, including additional requirements, if any, specified in SCC, and in any subsequent instructions ordered by the purchaser.

10 Delivery and documents

10.1 Delivery of the goods shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the terms specified in the contract. The details of shipping and/or other documents to be furnished by the supplier are specified in SCC.

10.2 Documents to be submitted by the supplier are specified in SCC.

11 Insurance

11.1 The goods supplied under the contract shall be fully insured in a freely convertible currency against loss or damage incidental to manufacture or acquisition, transportation, storage and delivery in the manner specified in the SCC.

12 Transportation

12.1 Should a price other than an all-inclusive delivered price be required, this shall be specified in the SCC.

13 Incidental services

13.1 The supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following services, including additional services, if any, specified in SCC:

13.1.1 performance or supervision of on-site assembly and/or commissioning of the supplied goods;

13.1.2 furnishing of tools required for assembly and/or maintenance of the supplied goods;

13.1.3 furnishing of a detailed operations and maintenance manual for each appropriate unit of the supplied goods;

13.1.4 performance or supervision or maintenance and/or repair of the supplied goods, for a period of time agreed by the parties, provided that this service shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under this contract; and

13.1.5 Training of the purchaser's personnel, at the supplier's plant and/or on-site, in assembly, start-up, operation, maintenance, and/or repair of the supplied goods.

13.2 Prices charged by the supplier for incidental services, if not included in the contract price for the goods, shall be agreed upon in advance by the parties and shall not exceed the prevailing rates charged to other parties by the supplier for similar services.

14 Spare parts

14.1 As specified in SCC, the supplier may be required to provide any or all of the following materials, notifications, and information pertaining to spare parts manufactured or distributed by the supplier:

14.1.1 such spare parts as the purchaser may elect to purchase from the supplier, provided that this election shall not relieve the supplier of any warranty obligations under the contract; and

14.1.2 in the event of termination of production of the spare parts:

14.1.2.1 Advance notification to the purchaser of the pending termination, in sufficient time to permit

the purchaser to procure needed requirements; and

- 14.1.2.2 following such termination, furnishing at no cost to the purchaser, the blueprints, drawings, and specifications of the spare parts, if requested.

15 Warranty

- 15.1 The supplier warrants that the goods supplied under the contract are new, unused, of the most recent or current models, and that they incorporate all recent improvements in design and materials unless provided otherwise in the contract. The supplier further warrants that all goods supplied under this contract shall have no defect, arising from design, materials, or workmanship (except when the design and/or material is required by the purchaser's specifications) or from any act or omission of the supplier, that may develop under normal use of the supplied goods in the conditions prevailing in the country of final destination.
- 15.2 This warranty shall remain valid for twelve (12) months after the goods, or any portion thereof as the case may be, have been delivered to and accepted at the final destination indicated in the contract, or for eighteen (18) months after the date of shipment from the port or place of loading in the source country, whichever period concludes earlier, unless specified otherwise in SCC.
- 15.3 The purchaser shall promptly notify the supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty.
- 15.4 Upon receipt of such notice, the supplier shall, within the period specified in SCC and with all reasonable speed, repair or replace the defective goods or parts thereof, without costs to the purchaser.
- 15.5 If the supplier, having been notified, fails to remedy the defect(s) within the period specified in SCC, the purchaser may proceed to take such remedial action as may be necessary, at the supplier's risk and expense and without prejudice to any other rights which the purchaser may have against the supplier under the contract.

16 Payment

- 16.1 The method and conditions of payment to be made to the supplier under this contract shall be specified in SCC.
- 16.2 The supplier shall furnish the purchaser with an invoice accompanied by a copy of the delivery note and upon fulfilment of other obligations stipulated in the contract.
- 16.3 Payments shall be made promptly by the purchaser, but in no case later than thirty (30) days after submission of an invoice or claim by the supplier.
- 16.4 Payment will be made in rand unless otherwise stipulated in SCC.

17 Prices

- 17.1 Prices charged by the supplier for goods delivered and services performed under the contract shall not vary from the prices quoted by the supplier in his bid, with the exception of any price adjustments authorised in SCC or in the purchaser's Request for Proposal validity extension, as the case may be.

18 Contract amendments

- 18.1 No variation in or modification of the terms of the contract shall be made except by written amendment signed by the parties concerned.

19 Assignment

19.1 The supplier shall not assign, in whole or in part, its obligations to perform under the contract, except with the purchaser's prior written consent.

20 Subcontracts

20.1 The supplier shall notify the purchaser in writing of all subcontracts awarded under this contract if not already specified in the bid. Such notification, in the original bid or later, shall not relieve the supplier from any liability or obligation under the contract.

21 Delays in the supplier's performance

21.1 Delivery of the goods and performance of services shall be made by the supplier in accordance with the time schedule prescribed by the purchaser in the contract.

21.2 If at any time during performance of the contract, the supplier or its subcontractor(s) should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the goods and performance of services, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the supplier's notice, the purchaser shall evaluate the situation and may at his discretion extend the supplier's time for performance, with or without the imposition of penalties, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of contract.

21.3 The right is reserved to procure outside of the contract small quantities or to have minor essential services executed if an emergency arises, the supplier's point of supply is not situated at or near the place where the supplies are required, or the supplier's services are not readily available.

21.4 Except as provided under GCC Clause 25, a delay by the supplier in the performance of its delivery obligations shall render the supplier liable to the imposition of penalties, pursuant to GCC Clause 22, unless an extension of time is agreed upon pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2 without the application of penalties.

21.5 Upon any delay beyond the delivery period in the case of a supplies contract, the purchaser shall, without cancelling the contract, be entitled to purchase supplies of a similar quality and up to the same quantity in substitution of the goods not supplied in conformity with the contract and to return any goods delivered later at the supplier's expense and risk, or to cancel the contract and buy such goods as may be required to complete the contract and without prejudice to his other rights, be entitled to claim damages from the supplier.

22 Penalties

22.1 Subject to GCC Clause 25, if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods or to perform the services within the period(s) specified in the contract, the purchaser shall, without prejudice to its other remedies under the contract, deduct from the contract price, as a penalty, a sum calculated on the delivered price of the delayed goods or unperformed services using the current prime interest rate calculated for each day of the delay until actual delivery or performance. The purchaser may also consider termination of the contract pursuant to GCC Clause 23.

23 Termination for default

23.1 The purchaser, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of contract, by written notice of default sent to the supplier, may terminate this contract in whole or in part:

- 23.1.1 if the supplier fails to deliver any or all of the goods within the period(s) specified in the contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the purchaser pursuant to GCC Clause 21.2;
- 23.1.2 if the Supplier fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
- 23.1.3 if the supplier, in the judgment of the purchaser, has engaged in corrupt or fraudulent practices in competing for or in executing the contract.
- 23.2 In the event the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, goods, works or services similar to those undelivered, and the supplier shall be liable to the purchaser for any excess costs for such similar goods, works or services. However, the supplier shall continue performance of the contract to the extent not terminated.
- 23.3 Where the purchaser terminates the contract in whole or in part, the purchaser may decide to impose a restriction penalty on the supplier by prohibiting such supplier from doing business with the public sector for a period not exceeding 10 years.
- 23.4 If a purchaser intends imposing a restriction on a supplier or any person associated with the supplier, the supplier will be allowed a time period of not more than fourteen (14) days to provide reasons why the envisaged restriction should not be imposed. Should the supplier fail to respond within the stipulated fourteen (14) days the purchaser may regard the intended penalty as not objected against and may impose it on the supplier.
- 23.5 Any restriction imposed on any person by the Accounting Officer / Authority will, at the discretion of the Accounting Officer / Authority, also be applicable to any other enterprise or any partner, manager, director or other person who wholly or partly exercises or exercised or may exercise control over the enterprise of the first-mentioned person, and with which enterprise or person the first-mentioned person, is or was in the opinion of the Accounting Officer / Authority actively associated.
- 23.6 If a restriction is imposed, the purchaser must, within five (5) working days of such imposition, furnish the National Treasury, with the following information:
- 23.6.1 the name and address of the supplier and / or person restricted by the purchaser;
- 23.6.2 the date of commencement of the restriction
- 23.6.3 the period of restriction; and
- 23.6.4 the reasons for the restriction.
- 23.7 These details will be loaded in the National Treasury's central database of suppliers or persons prohibited from doing business with the public sector.
- 23.8 If a court of law convicts a person of an offence as contemplated in sections 12 or 13 of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act, No. 12 of 2004, the court may also rule that such person's name be endorsed on the Register for Tender Defaulters. When a person's name has been endorsed on the Register, the person will be prohibited from doing business with the public sector for a period not less than five years and not more than 10 years. The National Treasury is empowered to determine the period of restriction and each case will be dealt with on its own merits. According to section 32 of the Act the Register must be open to the public. The Register can be perused on the National Treasury website.

24 Anti-dumping and countervailing duties and rights

- 24.1 When, after the date of bid, provisional payments are required, or anti-dumping or countervailing duties are imposed, or the amount of a provisional payment or anti-dumping or countervailing

right is increased in respect of any dumped or subsidized import, the State is not liable for any amount so required or imposed, or for any such increase. When, after the said date, such a provisional payment is no longer required or any such anti-dumping or countervailing right is abolished, or where the amount of such provisional payment or any such right is reduced, any such favourable difference shall on demand be paid forthwith by the contractor to the State or the State may deduct such amounts from moneys (if any) which may otherwise be due to the contractor in regard to supplies or services which he delivered or rendered, or is to deliver or render in terms of the contract or any other contract or any other amount which may be due to him.

25 Force majeure

25.1 Notwithstanding the provisions of GCC Clauses 22 and 23, the supplier shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, damages, or termination for default if and to the extent that his delay in performance or other failure to perform his obligations under the contract is the result of an event of force majeure.

25.2 If a force majeure situation arises, the supplier shall promptly notify the purchaser in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the purchaser in writing, the supplier shall continue to perform its obligations under the contract as far as is reasonably practical and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the force majeure event.

26 Termination for insolvency

26.1 The purchaser may at any time terminate the contract by giving written notice to the supplier if the supplier becomes bankrupt or otherwise insolvent. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the supplier, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the purchaser.

27 Settlement of disputes

27.1 If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the purchaser and the supplier in connection with or arising out of the contract, the parties shall make every effort to resolve amicably such dispute or difference by mutual consultation.

27.2 If, after thirty (30) days, the parties have failed to resolve their dispute or difference by such mutual consultation, then either the purchaser or the supplier may give notice to the other party of his intention to commence with mediation. No mediation in respect of this matter may be commenced unless such notice is given to the other party.

27.3 Should it not be possible to settle a dispute by means of mediation, it may be settled in a South African court of law.

27.4 Mediation proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with the rules of procedure specified in the SCC.

27.5 Notwithstanding any reference to mediation and/or court proceedings herein,

27.5.1 the parties shall continue to perform their respective obligations under the contract unless they otherwise agree; and

27.5.2 the purchaser shall pay the supplier any monies due the supplier.

28 Limitation of liability

28.1 Except in cases of criminal negligence or wilful misconduct, and in the case of infringement

pursuant to Clause 6;

- 28.1.1 the supplier shall not be liable to the purchaser, whether in contract, tort, or otherwise, for any indirect or consequential loss or damage, loss of use, loss of production, or loss of profits or interest costs, provided that this exclusion shall not apply to any obligation of the supplier to pay penalties and/or damages to the purchaser; and
- 28.1.2 the aggregate liability of the supplier to the purchaser, whether under the contract, in tort or otherwise, shall not exceed the total contract price, provided that this limitation shall not apply to the cost of repairing or replacing defective equipment.

29 Governing language

- 29.1 The contract shall be written in English. All correspondence and other documents pertaining to the contract that is exchanged by the parties shall also be written in English.

30 Applicable law

- 30.1 The contract shall be interpreted in accordance with South African laws, unless otherwise specified in SCC.

31 Notices

- 31.1 Every written acceptance of a bid shall be posted to the supplier concerned by registered or certified mail and any other notice to him shall be posted by ordinary mail to the address furnished in his bid or to the address notified later by him in writing and such posting shall be deemed to be proper service of such notice
- 31.2 The time mentioned in the contract documents for performing any act after such aforesaid notice has been given, shall be reckoned from the date of posting of such notice.

32 Taxes and duties

- 32.1 A foreign supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, stamp duties, license fees, and other such levies imposed outside the purchaser's country.
- 32.2 A local supplier shall be entirely responsible for all taxes, duties, license fees, etc., incurred until delivery of the contracted goods to the purchaser.
- 32.3 No contract shall be concluded with any bidder whose tax matters are not in order. Prior to the award of a bid, the Department must be in possession of a tax compliance status or SARS Pin, submitted by the bidder.

33 National Industrial Participation (NIP) Programme

- 33.1 The NIP Programme administered by the DTI shall be applicable to all contracts that are subject to the NIP obligation.

34 Prohibition of restrictive practices

- 34.1 In terms of section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, is prohibited if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if a bidder (s) is / are or a contractor(s) was / were involved in collusive bidding (or bid rigging).
- 34.2 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), based on reasonable grounds or evidence obtained by the purchaser, has / have engaged in the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may refer the matter to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of

administrative penalties as contemplated in the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998.

34.3 If a bidder(s) or contractor(s), has / have been found guilty by the Competition Commission of the restrictive practice referred to above, the purchaser may, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided for, invalidate the bid(s) for such item(s) offered, and / or terminate the contract in whole or part, and / or restrict the bidder(s) or contractor(s) from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years and / or claim damages from the bidder(s) or contractor(s) concerned.

TERMS OF REFERENCE /SPECIFICATION

Provision of Team Transport services for Mechanised Harvesting Team for a period of one (1) year.

1. BACKGROUND OF SAFCOL

SAFCOL is a state-owned forestry company listed as Schedule 2 major public entity in terms of the Public Finance Management Act 1 of 1999. It was established in 1992 following the promulgation of the Management of State Forest Act 128 of 1992 to promote the development in the long term of the forestry industry according to accepted commercial management practice in South Africa.

2. SCOPE OF WORK

Due to operational requirements, Mechanised harvesting doesn't make use of supervisors and SAFCOL team transportation. The successful bidder shall provide daily transport for mechanised harvesting employees, depending on the operational needs as determined by the Contract Manager (market requirements can change that will require team movements) to various plantation in the Sabie and Graskop area. Teams need to be transported daily as per shift requirement to the various plantations. Mechanised harvesting employees reside at various locations in and around Sabie town (Harmony hill, Simile and Tweefontein village).

3. DELIVERY OF GOODS OR SERVICES

3.1 Team transportation

- Mechanised harvesting teams work on a multi shift (2 to 3 shifts/day) system on various plantations in the Sabie/Graskop area depending on monthly market requirements. Therefore, three trips per day per team may be required for transportation of 4 mechanised teams.

The shift times are as follows:

- 1st shift 06h00 to 15h00
- 2nd shift 14h00 to 23h00
- 3rd shift 22h00 to 06h00

(It should be noted that the time schedule for shifts may change according to operational requirements)

- Teams need to be transported for an estimate 245 days per year, which may include weekends and public holidays.
- Teams and or team members need to be collected from various predetermined collection points in and around Sabie as determined by the Contract Manager.
- Teams and/or team members need to be delivered at least 10 minutes before the shift commence and collected at shift end.
- Teams to be transported separate from any tools, equipment and/or fuel. Equipment, tools and fuel will be transported on a trailer or luggage box fitted on the vehicle.

A total number of four (4) teams need to be transported.

- Transport to be provided separately for each team.
- 2 vehicles with a minimum of 12 passenger seats
- 2 vehicles with a minimum of 6 passenger seats will be required for team transportation.
- No people may be transported on the back of an open vehicle.
- Currently the base of operations is Sabie and Graskop with surrounding plantations - Blyde/Morgenzon, Wilgeboom, Tweefontein, Bergvliet/Spitskop, Brooklands and Witklip, however this can change if teams may be required to work at other areas.

- The estimated transport distance will vary from 5 up to 60 km one way. This can change depending on market requirements.

3.2 Other transport requirements

The Contract Manager may from time to time, request the successful bidder for the following transport requirements:

- Transportation of team employees for medical reasons during and/or out of shifts if the need arise.
- Transportation of equipment and tools required for operational requirements.
- Transportation of team members for other operational requirements
- Transportation of team members for emergency purposes
- Transportation of team members and their belongings for the movement of teams between operational areas due to operational requirements
- Transportation of other SAFCOL operational and business units and/or team members for operational requirements
- Transportation of teams for any other transport requirement approved by the Contract Manager.

4. REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS

4.1 The bidder

The National Land Transport Act 2009 stipulates that the successful bidder shall be in the possession of a valid operating licence to transport teams issued by the local Traffic Department.

The successful bidder shall comply to the following:

- SAFCOL SHEQ and IMS standards and procedures for the transportation of mechanised harvesting teams.
- National Road Traffic Act 93, 1996 (NRTA)
- National Land Transport Act 5, 2009 (NLTA)
- The National Road Traffic Act Regulations
- Labour Relations Act 66, 1995 (LRA)
- Basic Conditions of Employment Act 75, 1997, as amended in 2002 (BCEA)
- Occupational Health and Safety Act 85, 1993 (OHSA)
- Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 130, 1993 as amended in 1997 (COIDA)
- The Road Accident Fund Act 56, 1996 (RAF)
- International Labour Organisation (ILO) Health and Safety Standards
- Registered in terms of the Compensation for Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 130 of 1993 (COIDA).
- Compiling rules outlining the responsibilities of drivers and additional training should be offered if required.
- Appointment of drivers that are competent, responsible, medically fit and hold a valid driver's license.
- Pay drivers at least the minimum statutory wage as annually gazetted.
- Appoint a transport manager as a key person to manage the project and liaise with the mechanised harvesting Contract Manager
- Manage drivers working time to ensure that overtime is complying according to legislative regulations.
- Attend safety meetings as prescribed by the mechanised harvesting transport Contract Manager
- Valid Passenger liability insurance of at least R5 000 000
- Valid Vehicle insurance
- Supply the necessary required transport capacity as and when required to suit the mechanised harvesting transport requirement.

- Be in good standing with the local taxi associations.

4.2 Vehicles:

In addition to the standard minimum specifications and in compliance with the provisions of the National Road Traffic Act, as amended, all transportation supplied, shall meet the following basic specifications:

- SANS-approved three-point safety belts for every seat
- No fold-up or jockey seats.
- A speed warning sign shall be displayed on the back of the minibus in accordance with the National Road Traffic Act.
- The tyres shall comply with the manufacturer's specification for commercial use. Tyres of different brand, size and type) may not be fitted on any vehicle.
- The minibus shall have at least one emergency exit for every 12 passengers.
- In a safe, serviceable and roadworthy condition at all times
- Conduct annual certificate of fitness.
- Registered and licensed
- The vehicles must be equipped with the manufacture's safety equipment. (Spare tyre, jack, tyre spanner, triangles, fire extinguisher)
- Able to drive on tar and forestry roads.
- Airconditioned and dust free as reasonable possible
- Be always clean.
- No transportation of fuel without prior approval from the Contract Manager
- Fitted with a tow bar hitch to pull a trailer to carry tools such as chainsaws, chainsaw chain, refuelling containers, gazebos when required. No tools or equipment to be transported with employees.
- Transportation vehicles and trailers shall comply with appropriate signage: chevron (retro-reflective stickers) and should go around 80% of vehicle fitted in compliance with the National Road Traffic Act requirement.
- A service book/history must be provided for each vehicle during the duration of the contract period.
- Transportation vehicles shall be maintained and service as per with the vehicle manufacturer's specification.
- The bidder's transportation assigned to the project will be fitted with SAFCOL tracker units to support and verify the log sheet/trip summaries for invoicing purposes.
- Transportation vehicles can be checked by the Mechanised harvesting artisans for mechanical soundness and compliance.
- The bidder must supply four (4) closed vehicles (bus type/taxi/SUV) with airconditioned interior for the transportation of the mechanised teams with tools.
- Licences are valid with COF.
- Tyres shall comply with the manufacturer's specification.
- No fold-up or jockey seats
- SANS-approved safety belts for every seat.
- Vehicles with no more than 500 000km on the odometer
- All lights are working.
- No steering defects.
- No brake defects.
- No significant oil leaks.

4.3 Drivers requirements:

- Drivers must operate vehicles according to the laws and regulations stipulated in the National Road Traffic Act, 1996
- Drivers are required to be medical fit and equipped with a valid driving licence issued by the Traffic Department
- The driver of the vehicle must have a valid PrDP – Professional Driving Permit (even occasionally/spare/substitute driver/s) with at least 2 years driving experience.
- Do annual medical certificate of fitness.
- The successful bidder`s drivers to be tested by SAFCOL Platorand.
- Drivers are required to adhere to the shift schedule of mechanised harvesting employees.
- Drivers are strictly prohibited from being under the influence of alcohol and drugs at any time.
- Drivers may be subjected to alcohol testing at any time.
- Compile daily vehicle inspection checklists for each vehicle utilised for the transportation of employees and submit to the mechanised harvesting contract Manager weekly.
- Log sheets or trip records are kept daily for each vehicle per trip as specified by the Contract Manager. This must include only the kms travelled assigned to the project. The log sheet will be the basis from where an invoice is generated. If an invoice is not supported by an approved log sheet, payment will not occur.

5. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

5.1 Penalty system

A penalty system will be implemented for the management of non - performance of transport services. Table 1 displays the non-conformances with the value or action for the specific penalty. Raised non-conformance penalties will be accumulated per month and deducted for the specific month when the non-conformances occurred.

Vehicle tracking devices will be utilised to monitor transportation performance. The total amount of penalties will be deducted from the successful bidder`s monthly invoice.

5.2 Transportation of fuel

No vehicle will be allowed to transport any unauthorised fuel in any type of container without prior approval from the Contract Manager. Unauthorised transportation of fuel may lead to the cancellation of the contract. Where the transportation of fuel is authorised by the Contract Manager, it must be transported separate from the people as stated in 3.1.

5.3 Team transportation outside of proposed area

5.3.1 The contact manager may request the successful bidder to supply team transportation on other plantations due to operational requirements.

5.4 Back up service

The bidder needs to provide alternative available transport, should there be a mechanical breakdown or failure of the supplied transport capacity. The back up vehicles must be of the same type of vehicles supplied for the transportation of the mechanised teams.

6. PRICE

6.1 Bidding price

The bidding price will be calculated according to the project`s fixed cost, variable cost and a % mark up.

The bidder must complete the attach schedules to calculate the bidding price for the contract period (Annexure 1 to 6).

6.2 Price adjustments

6.2.1 Monthly fuel adjustments

The quoted rate will be adjusted monthly according to the fuel prices published monthly by the Department of Energy for the zone the bidder is transporting in. Only the fuel portion of the quoted rate will be used for adjustment calculation. The fuel price adjustment will be done according to the Magisterial District zone prices. The fuel portion should be between 20% and 23% of the quoted rate per km.

7. EVALUATION CRITERIA

The evaluation criteria for the assessment of the proposals will be based on both qualitative and financial aspects of the proposal. Service Providers will be evaluated on functionality. The bidders that score points which equal to or exceed the minimum threshold provided on functionality will further be evaluated on price and specific goals provided in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2022. The Bid documents will be evaluated individually on a score sheet, by a representative of the evaluation panel according to the evaluation criteria indicated in the Terms of Reference.

All bidders who score less than 60 out of 100 points for functionality will not be considered further.

This bid will be evaluated on 80/20 preference point system.

In accordance with the SAFCOL Supply Chain Management Policy, the bid evaluation process shall be carried out in three (3) phases namely:

- Phase 1 (a) Administrative Compliance
- Phase 1 (b) Compulsory Briefing session attendance
- Phase 1 (c) Mandatory requirements
